Junior Department Rules

The junior department is for youth who want to enter exhibits at the La Habra Valley Community Fair. There are a number of organizations that want competition within their specific organization. The La Habra Valley Community Fair can do this by establishing divisions and classes for groups such as FFA, 4-H and others. The L.H.V.C.F will provide the opportunity for young people to exhibit who are not members of an organized group. Independent Junior exhibitors will compete in the appropriate class in direct competition with other 4H and FFA members.

***All livestock classes are reserved for 4-H and FFA members**

Community Youth

FFA Members: may participate in classes when they enroll in high school agriculture education courses and may show until the end of the next calendar year following graduation.

4-H Membership: enrollment is open to all youth from kindergarten through 12th grade through December 31st of the year in which they turn 19 years of age.

4-H Primary: members must be 5 years old or in Kindergarten by Dec. 31st of the program year. Primary members **cannot** enroll in large animal projects. **Approved** animal projects are dogs, rabbits, cats, poultry, cavies, pygmy goats.

Independent Junior Exhibitors: An independent junior is a youth in our community Ages 5-19 and enrolled in our local school districts or living in the City limits or county zones in 90631.

This dog show is designed to be a learning experience. Judges will give you helpful pointers to encourage your improvement.

DOG CARE/TRAINING RULES:

1. Exhibitors must be currently enrolled in the Dog Care/Training Project.
2. Dogs exhibited can be any mixture or purebred.
3. Female dogs in season may not be shown.
4. Dogs must be licensed, with proper verification of current Rabies and all other vaccinations including Parvo (Corona and Bordetella are strongly recommended).
5. Exhibitors: Primary (ages 5 to 8 on Dec. 31, 2010), Junior (ages 9 to 10 on Dec. 31, 2010), Intermediate (ages 11 to 13 on Dec. 31, 2010) and Senior (ages 14 to 18 on Dec. 31, 2010).
6. Two obedience divisions per exhibitor. One showmanship division per exhibitor.
7. One Agility division per exhibitor
8. Exhibitors are responsible for watering and cleaning up after their dogs.
9. Dogs must not be left unattended.
10. Exhibitors who have received a trophy or medal in a PREVIOUS YEAR are not eligible to receive a trophy or medal in the same class with the same dog.
11. Any dog abuse will result in immediate disqualification.
12. If a member is using a dog that they did not train from a puppy, the dog must be shown at the dog's highest level of achievement by the Youth.
13. Only Primary members may share dog's for obedience and agility. For the purposes of showmanship only, a dog may be shared by members of the same family unit.
14. No Security Dogs allowed: example: pit bull, Rottweiler
 - o **Dogs are not allowed in buildings unless they are service dogs**
 - o **Dogs must be caged when not in show ring and can be at the dog area or campground only.**
15. **Please note that our computer system will not accept an incomplete form. If your entry form is not completely filled out correctly it will be returned to you.**

- GENERAL REMINDERS FOR THE SHOW DAY:
 - Grooming and bathing should be done at home the day or two before; just bring a brush for touchup.
 - Water dishes are a must and a jug of water for your dog.
 - Dogs must be on a leash at all times.
 - As the weather could be quite warm, choose some shade for your dog and keep him quiet before his class. Show rings will be in the sun. A spray bottle with water is good for misting your dog down.
 - You are responsible for cleaning up after your dog, please bring a baggie or two.
 - As fleas are a problem during the summer it is advisable to spray your dog before coming to the show.

DOG OBEDIENCE AREA

Div 500: Introductory Dog Obedience

Classes 01, & 03.

For members and dogs who have never shown in a 4-H or sanctioned obedience class. Exercises will be: heel, figure eight, stand for examination, recall, 30 second set, and 90 second down. All exercises on leash.

Div 501: Beginning Dog Obedience (A)

Classes 01, 04, 05, 06.

For members who have shown once previously and are unable to do off-leash work. Same exercises as Introductory Dog Obedience.

Div 502: Beginning Dog Obedience (B)

Classes 01, 04, 05, 06.

For members who have shown more than once previously and are unable to do off-leash work. Same exercises as Introductory Dog Obedience.

Div 503: Experienced Dog Obedience

Classes 01, 04, 05, 06.

For member and dogs who have not obtained a qualifying score (170 +) in an AKC/AMBOR show. Exercises will be: on and off leash heeling, figure eight, stand for exam, recall, one minute long sits, and three minute long downs.

Div 504: Novice Dog Obedience

Classes 01, 04, 05, 06.

Exercises will be standard AKC routine: on and off leash, including one minute long sits and three minute long downs.

Div 505: Graduate Novice Dog Obedience

Classes 01, 04, 05, 06.

Exercises will be on and off leash heeling, figure eight off leash, three minute long sits and five minute long downs with handler out of sight, and drop on recall.

Div 506: Open Dog Obedience

Classes 01, 03, 04, 05, 06.

For members who are beginning Open training. All those competing in Novice or Graduate Novice Obedience may participate.

Div 507: Dog Showmanship

Classes 01, 03, 04, 05, 06.

For members who are learning to handle dogs for confirmation shows.

DOG AGILITY AREA

Div 508: Introductory Dog Agility

Classes 01, 03, 04, 05, 06.

For members and dogs who have never shown in a 4-H or sanctioned agility class. Exercises will include: tunnels, jumps, tables, chutes, and may include dog walk, teter and weave poles.

Div 509: Beginning Dog Agility

Classes 01, 04, 05, 06.

For members and dogs who have shown in a 4-H or sanctioned agility class but not obtained a qualifying score. Exercises will include: tunnels, jumps, tables, chutes, and may include dog walk, teter and weave poles.

Div 510: Experienced Dog Agility

Classes 01, 04, 05, 06.

For members and dogs who have shown in a 4-H or sanctioned agility class and obtained a qualifying score. Exercises will include: tunnels, jumps, tables, chutes, and may include dog walk, teter and weave poles.
